Training

Field Operations October 2011 Monthly

The Field Operations Division consists of 4 uniformed patrol shifts which provide 24 hour service to citizens and visitors of Beaumont. The Street Crimes Unit targets special issues, through directed patrol assignments and bicycle patrol. Their hours are flexible, depending on the issues that need their attention. The K9 Unit has 4 patrol /drug dogs and one bloodhound. The K9 Officers and their partners are assigned hours to supplement the Patrol shifts and are on call to assist as needed. The Traffic Unit, which includes both motorcycles and patrol cars, work a variety of hours and are also subject to call out for fatality crash investigations.

Significant Events

- 10/13/11 While checking a local apartment parking lot for auto burglaries, Officers located a vehicle with an open door and a large quantity of electronics and copper wire inside. Surveillance was conducted and when the actor returned, a foot chase ensued. After the apprehension of the suspects it was discovered that they were responsible for five auto burglaries in that complex.
- 10/30/11 Officers were out on a disturbance at the Red Carpet Inn, when a subject fled on foot. It was later learned that the subject was wanted by the U.S. Marshalls Service. The subject was located again and after a traffic stop, fled on foot a second time. He was eventually caught and arrested.

- 10/31/11 Officers were dispatched to Easley @ Greenfield in reference to a subject that had been bound and robbed by several actors. The offense originated in Hardin County and as the investigation progressed it was discovered that the actors lived in the area. BPD officers located the actors and arrests were made in the Aggravated Robbery case.

Significant Events

Significant Events

- Street Crimes located and arrested several robbery suspects in the area of Parkdale Mall. The suspects had stolen a large number of items from Macy's and when apprehended by security, security was pepper sprayed by the suspects. The suspects were apprehended as they were attempting to flee and or hide in the area of the mall.
- Street Crimes officers apprehended a theft suspect from the Halloween Express after a foot chase.
- Street Crimes officers assisted with the apprehension of Michael August who had a warrant out for his arrest. He was the last suspect to be apprehended for the threats to detectives.
- Street Crimes worked the areas of 11th and Sweetgum, Park and Cartwright, Ashley and Center, Lincoln and Brooklyn and Pear and Grant. Several self-initiated calls for service were generated, field contacts were completed and arrests were made. Street Crimes officers worked with Code Enforcement in attempting to alleviate some of the problems in these areas.
- Street Crimes assisted with two 5K runs this month. We assisted with traffic control and intersections.

Significant Events

- There was one Homicide reported in the month of October 2011. It occurred when the homeowner shot and killed one of the suspects who had attempted to rob him in his home. This occurred at 2450 Durden.
- Burglary detectives have been working cases with robbery detectives against a family that has committed numerous burglaries, robberies, and thefts. Several of the family members have been arrested and are being held with no bond. Burglaries in the south end were reduced after they were apprehended.
- The Auto Theft Task Force Public Awareness Officer oversaw six crime prevention / public awareness programs during the month reaching more than 1,000,000 people. This included manning a booth at a local mall during the National Night Out on Crime that was viewed by an estimated 400 people
- A Narcotics Unit surveillance operation was conducted which resulted in the seizure of methamphetamine, components of a lab and the arrest of three individual involved with cooking, processing and distributing the drug. Interdiction was instrumental in many of the above mentioned cases and was responsible for a currency seizure in excess of \$12,000.00.
